A SNIPPET FROM THE YEAR BOOK OF PRAYER: The First Presbyterian Church in Niles, Ohio, was a thriving congregation of more than 1,000 members before the local economy collapsed. Their membership dropped to fewer than 140. But those members refused to give up or simply survive. Instead, they increased their outreach. They began volunteering in a low- income housing complex. They cleaned up the litter-strewn grounds and broken glass and refurbished its playground. They held a vacation Bible school in the complex that summer, hauling tables and chairs to a parking lot and stretching a tarp overhead for shade. More than forty children participated, and for three years VBS was held there until renovation construction took over the site. The members then turned their attention to a mobile home park that needed attention, providing funds for supplemental nutrition, renovating the park playgrounds, and moving the vacation Bible school to a different parking lot that served the residents of that park.
