**Skeet's Pantry Needs Some Food!** With many thanks to all our friends in the congregation who have been so generous, we're asking again for some food for our pantry. Specifically, we need PASTA, RICE and CEREAL. Any kind, any size (but think "family

size" if possible) will be very welcome. So thanks again for always being there when we need your help!

**Snippets from the Year Book of Prayer:** An interesting, contributing organization known as Teethsavers International is sponsored by Westminster Presbyterian Church in Lubbock, Texas. In 2004, a dentist, filled with love and concern for the poor and hurting children of the world began his work of providing dental care to the children at the Meheba Refugee Camp in Zambia. Since then, Teethsavers has treated children in Zambia, Malawi, Sierra Leone, Gambia, Uganda, Morocco, Belize and Nicaragua and has trained indigenous people to carry on the work. Teethsavers workers go into outlying villages where there is no running water or electricity and treat children by a special technique which allows dental fillings without drilling and at a cost of pennies. The children treated are given clothing and books as well as toothbrushes, but, more important, workers are also able to tell them about the love of Jesus.

**Bread for the World:** It is not just here in the United States that efforts need to be made to reduce and eventually reduce hunger. And it is not only for the immediate need of the hungry people that we are thinking. It is greatly to our benefit that we take necessary steps to reduce hunger everywhere in the world. Many of us have the mistaken idea that we give enormous amount of help to third world countries. And we do give big amounts of money. But on a percentage basis of our wealth, we give a paltry 1% - hard to believe perhaps, but true. So, we are not as generous as most of us think we are! So we should urge our government officials to give serious thought to increasing the kind of aid that leads to self-development projects, particularly among women, and that will help to make families well fed. By providing people with the tools they need to lift themselves out of poverty, we create a more stable world. For every 5% drop in income growth in a developing country, the likelihood of violent conflict or war within the next year increases by 10 percent. And a final bit of information: "Forty-three of the top 50 consumer nations of U.S. agricultural products were once U.S. foreign aid recipients. So foreign aid would seem to be a case of casting out bread upon the water and having it come back with jam on it."
